New Tutor Training Classes in 2016



PSC needs new tutors! Thank you for all you do to talk us up to friends, family, and colleagues. Hearing about your experiences with tutoring encourages others to learn more about PSC and to consider becoming a volunteer tutor.

1. **Post a Flyer** - Do you belong to a club, place of worship, or place of employment with a bulletin board or other place to post a flyer about volunteering with PSC? Talk to us - we'd love to send you flyers or cards to display.

2. **Spread the Word** - If you know someone who would make a great PSC tutor, share the dates for the 2016 tutor training sessions with them:

Winter 2016: Wednesday, January 20 and Saturdays January 23 and 30

Spring 2016: Wednesday, April 27 and Saturdays April 30 and May 7

Fall 2016: Wednesday, September 14 and Saturdays September 17 and 24

Registration for New Tutor Training always begins six weeks before the Wednesday night session of training.

Wilson training usually follows a few weeks after the second Saturday of training. If you wish to take the Wilson training, speak to a PSC staff member.



New Online Gifts from the Library by Kate

Here's more proof that Contra Costa County Library is the best deal around. In addition to other services that you may already use through the library website – free museum passes (*Discover & Go*), eBooks, streamed audiobooks, and digital magazines (*Flipster*) – now there's more!

1. Language Skills – *Pronunciator* is a wildly exciting new library offering for our ESL students and anyone who wants to learn a foreign language. This is *Rosetta Stone* on steroids, and it is available on both Apple and Android phones and tablets, too.

Program Features:

- 80 languages are taught
- a choice of 50 languages for the narration/instruction (When learning English, a Korean speaker can elect to get explanations in Korean.)
- lots of lesson material: 350+ hours of instruction
- shorter courses for travel basics and citizenship
- progress tracking and certificates of completion
- scores, progress, and bookmarks are synched across all your devices (phone, laptop, etc.)

To use:

- Register at <u>www.pronunciator.com</u> with your library card. You'll then be emailed a user name and password.
- Log in, select your language, and explore!

The comprehensive "Main Course" in *Pronunciator* assumes no prior knowledge of the new language. Click around for lots(!) of activities with grammar, real-time pronunciation scores, job interview questions, music lyrics, captioned movies, virtual conversations, and more.

Alternatively, "Learning Guides" are more structured, 8week classes offered at different starting levels. A logical way for PSC students to start would be to choose a level in "Learning Guide," go to the "Drills" tab and select "Listening." After finishing the drills, move on to the "Quizzes" tab.

2. Test Prep – The *Testing & Education Reference Center* database has prep materials and online practice tests for anyone studying for vocational or immigration exams. To access, go to *ccclib.org*, then click through to *Research* > *Articles* & *Databases* > *Testing* & *Education Reference Center*.

For test prep for the U.S. Citizenship Test, Test of English as a Foreign Language (TOEFL), and Test of English for International Communication (TOEIC), choose *International Tools*.

The *Career Tools* section has resources that could be useful to job hunting students and tutors alike, such as resume writing tools and computer tutorials, as well as preparation for vocational tests in real estate, cosmetology, accounting, postal service, and more.

3. Movies – *IndieFlix* is a free service on the Library website with unlimited access to thousands of film festival shorts, features, and documentaries. Watch movies on any Internet-enabled computer, smartphone, or tablet with a Web browser. Sort by language, genre or film length.
