

"Tutoring" for Tutors

Tutors sometimes ask us for more training. These three websites have great resources for tutors to build up their skills, knowledge, and confidence:

CLLS: California Library Literacy Resources (http://libraryliteracy.org/tutors/resources.html)

This website has helpful YouTube videos of tutoring sessions focusing on common tutoring topics, such as phonemic awareness, reading comprehension, building vocabulary using signal words, oral reading strategies, and lots more. Watch and steal what you like! Are you looking for ways to teach to the goal you picked on your PSC goal sheet? Follow the "Roles & Goals Curriculum" link and find PDF lesson ideas to fulfill each goal.

Proliteracy.org's Education Network: (https://www.proliteracy.org/Professional-Development/Education-Network)

Proliteracy.org has compiled resources from all over the literacy world. You can find everything from videos on decoding to online interactive lessons to professional papers and articles. You'll need to sign up for a free account and then "request" the video or document you'd like to view and have it added to your "transcript" page. From there, choose "Launch" to watch or view the material. It's a bit of a clunky website, but the content is worth your effort.

LINCS: Library Information and Communication System (https://lincs.ed.gov/)

LINCS is under the U.S. Department of Education. Through its Learning Portal (click the link on the upper right), you can sign up for access to a variety of short online courses that you can work through at your leisure. Look for ELL classes, like "Teaching Emergent Readers," or Learning Disability classes, like "Professional's Guide to Educating Adults," or

Teacher Effectiveness classes, like "Motivating Adult Learners to Persist."
